Sunday School, Youth Class

4th Sunday in Lent

"An Inside-Out Lenten Season"

Spring is here! "Lent" in Old English simply means "Spring is here." Ash Wednesday (March 5th), the beginning of Lent, means "the lengthening of days." I can tell you the days are getting longer.

With each lengthening Lenten day we all can learn wisdom. Wisdom comes about in many forms. One form is observing the negative behavior of others. As Kahlil Gibran said, "I have learned silence from the talkative, tolerance from the intolerant, and kindness from the unkind." (Hays, A Pilgrim's Almanac, 1989)


Let us take the opportunity which Lent provides us to carefully observe the behavior of others and ourselves. Observe what negative behavior is and do the opposite. A good spiritual practice is saying, "No," to what limits life for us and saying, "Yes" to what promotes a fuller life.

Saying "Yes" to a fuller life in Jesus Christ as "...The Way, The Truth, and The Life..." (John 14:6), helps us to counteract the "Noes" and "Nots" of negative behavior.

May we sojourn together to experience wisdom of positive and negative behaviors within ourselves by observing others. This year's community Lenten potlucks/studies and Good Friday service will focus on "The Way, The Truth, and The Life" inspired by the devotional writings of Henri J. M. Nouwen:


