"Stellar Fools for Christ"

I read a devotion several weeks prior to summer's Vacation Bible School (VBS). It became my personal VBS devotion. The devotion, written by Edward Hays (Pray All Ways, pp. 61-71, 1981), is the chapter titled, "Play as Prayer." He reflects upon people's need to "loosen up" and enjoy life. He invites his readers to be "Fools for Christ." The term, Fools for Christ, is a way of proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ through play.

Now, everyone has a different take on the word "play." Some folks only see the word as children playing with their toys, or with other children. Others may view the word play as the deep joy one receives while participating in a hobby, or in an adventure. Collecting antique cars, trucks, tractors, motorcycles, pocket knives, glass, pottery, and textiles can bring joy. Crafting and making things out of wood, metal, and leather allows fun and enjoyment. Even accomplishing daily living skills like sewing, cooking, baking, and gardening brings deep satisfaction and worth. Going on an adventure or trip involving camping, fishing, hunting, bird watching, or observing railroad trains are very exciting forms of play. Play becomes a behavior in which we express our thoughts and feelings about recreating ourselves in the image of God. Recreation (re-creation) is play.

Edward Hays' idea of play becoming prayer, and prayer becoming play, has resonated with me since my earliest days in ministry. To "do" the ministry of the Gospel is to play and pray simultaneously. Being Stellar Fools for Christ, the Church has the responsibility of telling the Divine Truth about God to all humankind through the gift of play in its many forms so both children and adults can experience the love, grace and mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ through the Holy Spirit.
