
OUR MISSION

"COLORING JESUS"

I want to thank everyone for the beautiful Easter cards Jane and I received these past several weeks. I was amazed by their vibrant colors. Many of the cards depict Jesus' resurrection with the simple use of spring pastel colors of light baby blue, green, pink—to egg yolk yellows and haunting reds—to deep dark colors of royal purple, forest green, and gold. In one form or another they tell the good news of Jesus' empty tomb. God's colorful rainbow prisms is the Church's artist palette.

I recall in my primary years what a joy it was to reach in the communal palette of collective crayons and pick a wrapped or unwrapped, a broken or unbroken crayon and let it glide across my Sunday school's coloring book. What a thrill it was to color in Jesus' cross, his empty tomb, and the words, "Alleluia! He is Risen!" A palette of crayons in Sunday school meant coloring and no reading. My preference in learning Scripture was coloring it and not reading it. Who would want to read when you can color Jesus?

Quite frankly, after all these years, I still prefer this method of learning and telling the story of Jesus by way of coloring. I know some of you agree with me in this joyful art of drawing and coloring Jesus for people to see and know Him. I imagine some of you have upgraded your coloring methods from the palette of crayons to paint brushes, colored markers, and ink pens. A palette of colors in the form of short slender colored wax sticks, or long slender colored pencils, or narrow colored markers, or narrow stubby ink pens, or the laying of paints such as oil, acrylic, or water pigments invite all of us to engage in telling Jesus' Easter story through color.

Coloring Easter calls us to be creative and to have joy. When you look at God's heavenly rainbow of colors—the sky is the limit in making a joyful noise to the Lord with coloring, especially, with those sparkling fireworks seen and heard on July 4th. It is a joy to share Jesus' story—life overcoming death. With such good news Easter brightens our lives. Worshipping every 52 Sundays is like celebrating Easter 52 times a year. Theologically, in our Presbyterian tradition, every Sunday is an Easter Sunday.

Let us color Jesus' Easter story and share God's love in Jesus Christ.

Happy Easter 52 Sundays a Year!



Stewardship

Dear Church Family and Friends!

The Presbyterian Foundation has selected Ten Scriptures for Stewardship to help all churches and encourage congregations through this time. The scriptures help us to reflect on stewardship, generosity and gratitude. Each newsletter, we will highlight a new scripture.

From Genesis 45:1-5 (Joseph offers forgiveness to his brothers.) Then Joseph could no longer control himself before all his attendants, and he cried out. "Have everyone leave my presence!" So there was no one with Joseph when he made himself known to his brothers. And he wept so loudly that the Egyptians heard him, and Pharaoh's household heard about it. Joseph said to his brothers, "I am Joseph! Is my father still living?" But his brothers were not able to answer him, because they were terrified at his presence. Then Joseph said to his brothers, "Come close to me." When they had done so he said, "I am your brother Joseph, the one you sold into Egypt! And now, do not be distressed and do not be angry with yourselves for selling me here, because it was to save lives that God sent me ahead of you."

The Joseph novella in Genesis, chapters 37-50, provides a beautiful case study in modeling generosity. Joseph is mistreated by his brothers and sold into slavery. He rises to become Pharaoh's vizier. His brothers come to Egypt in the midst of a famine and Joseph shares generously with his brothers, giving them not just food but forgiveness. This story reminds us that we have received so much from God: food for our bodies and forgiveness to heal our spirits and our lives. Therefore we are called to respond generously, just as Joseph responds generously to his brothers in their time of need. (Presbytery Foundation)
