"Hymning"

Many practice the spiritual formation of hymning. Often it starts with humming or singing favorite hymns when faced with a crisis, a trauma, or some manner of stress, tension, or anxiety. Also, it may start within ourselves silently or verbally in times of joyfulness, happiness, and thankfulness. Besides praying, I find the spiritual practice of hymning a bliss state. In reality singing or humming our favorite hymns is praying to God who creates, redeems, and sustains us daily. In essence for me, hymning is spiritual therapy.

I invite you to consciously practice the spiritual formation of hymning. Some steps which are commonly used by people when hymning are as follows: 1. Read the hymn; 2. Memorize the hymn; 3. Meditate on the hymn; 4. Hum the hymn; 5. Sing the hymn; 6. Play the hymn on a musical instrument; 7. Pray the hymn; 8. Quote the hymn; 9. Proclaim the hymn; 10. Lean on the hymn or draw strength from the hymn; 11. Teach the hymn to others, especially, the younger generations; and 12. Start and finish each day with a favorite hymn.

One of my favorite hymns to practice hymning is "Amazing Grace." The hymn's lyrics were written by The Rev. John Newton in 1779. The Rev. Newton never ceased to marvel at the grace of God that transformed him so completely from a rough, debauched seaman of merchant ships and Ship Master (Captain) of slave ships to a pious Christian pastor of the Anglican Church (The Church of England). Even in the midst of his piety as an Anglican priest, The Rev. Newton never lost sight of Jesus Christ being the great Savior and his own human condition of a repentant sinner. The first verse of "Amazing Grace" says it best: "Amazing grace—how sweet the sound-that saved a wretch like me! I once was lost but now am found, was blind but now I see." (Amazing Grace, Osbeck, p. 164, Kregel Publication, Grand Rapids, MI, 2002) I have often found with a hymn's historical background a new dimension in hymning can be achieved.

This year's community—ecumenical, Lenten study sponsored by The Birch Run Ministerial Association (i.e. Saints Francis and Clare Roman Catholic Church, Christ Lutheran Church, First Presbyterian Church of Taymouth, and the Birch Run/ Burt United Methodist Churches) will be examining the spiritual meaning of the hymn, "Amazing Grace." Every Wednesday evening, beginning March 1st through March 29th, starting at 6:00 p.m. with a potluck soup supper (see schedule printed elsewhere in newsletter for specific locations), one of the Birch Run Ministerial Association pastors will lead a devotional study reflecting on a verse of "Amazing Grace." This will be a great opportunity to learn something new and different about a favorite old hymn, and how hymning can contribute to our faith development.

Please don't forget our church's own Ash Wednesday Service, February 22nd, where we will enjoy our traditional potluck soup supper at 6:00 p.m., observe the Imposition of Ashes, celebrate Holy Communion, and sing "Amazing Grace."

The new budget year is well under way and you may have noticed a change in the bulletin reporting. The church budget has been divided into 52 weeks to better reflect the contributions. Per Capita and Initial Offering will remain with their respective total budgets.

The Per Capita rate for 2023 is \$29.77 per member. The new rate has increased by .77 cents per member. The Initial offering remains at \$5.00 per box of envelopes. Your
