### "A Thinking Soul"

The ancient Greek philosopher, Aristotle said, "The soul never thinks without a picture." (Emmons, The Little Book of Gratitude, p. 78, 2016) Many people say a picture is worth a thousand words. This is true with photographs, films, paintings, and cartoon sketches. The challenge, however, comes when asked to describe the picture with words.

Dr. Emmons, a psychologist, illustrates this with the classic film, "What a Wonderful Life." The main character, George Bailey, contemplates suicide because he feels the world would be better without him. The angel, Clarence Odbody, shows him exactly what the world would be without George Bailey. George gets the picture about the worth and value of living through the lens of gratitude for the life with which he has been blessed.

Dr. Emmons takes the film one step further and uses it in couples' counseling. What he calls the "George Bailey" effect is having couples examine their relationships by practicing gratitude. Through the eyes of George's guardian angel, Clarence, Dr. Emmons asks couples to write about ways in which their lives would have been different if they never met their spouse or partner. He finds this exercise has a greater impact on the couple's happiness than when they reflect on what they really appreciate about their spouse or partner.


I value Dr. Emmon's little book about gratitude. His approach in developing a grateful heart shows the development of love. Love is a deep reflection of gratitude. Dr. Emmon writes: "Gratitude is not just good medicine, though, a nice sentiment, a warm fuzzy feeling, or a strategy or tactic for being happier or healthier. We did not create or fashion ourselves, and we did not get where we are in life by ourselves. So living in gratitude is living in truth." (Emmons, p. 7, 2016)

Also, the Apostle Paul mentions about "living in truth" with a loving and grateful soul: "Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony...And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God." (Colossians 3:14,16)

May we all live in the truth of our Lord Jesus Christ who has blessed our souls with the ultimate picture. May the Holy Spirit guide us in both our written and spoken language to speak out and live out the love of Jesus Christ. May we be thankful and grateful for the insight of people like the Apostle Paul, Dr. Robert Emmons, and Aristotle to get our souls thinking.


Dear Church Family and Friends!
