Taymouth Tidings



"Notions and Motions"

Many things come to mind when I think of the Fourth of July—fireworks, parades, concerts, the American Flag, the Statue of Liberty, the Liberty Bell, and an obscure 19th Century book called <u>Democracy of America</u>. Alexis de Tocqueville, a Frenchman and scholar, wrote this book in 1835 after visiting America in 1831. He reflected upon what the world at that time, and what the world even today, considered to be the greatest political science experiment of modern history, the United States of America. He wanted to know what made America successful in establishing itself as a nation.

He discovered rather quickly it was not the bureaucratic institutions of civil government that made America successful. It was the peoples' ethos who lived and worked the land that made America the nation it is: *"America is a land of wonders, in which everything is in*

constant motion and every change seems an improvement...No natural boundary seems to be set to the efforts of man; and in his eyes what is not yet done is only what he has not yet attempted to do." (Hays, A Book of Wonders, 2009, p. 203)

For Tocqueville, an American is a person whose heart is reflected in the positioning of his or her hands. Not by what a person says, but by what a person does. What America does with its hands becomes a true reflection of what America believes. This notion and motion of being a nation, the United States of America, is reflected in our nation's high calling of being a beacon of hope for the world. This hope is symbolically depicted in the open invitation by a flaming torch and tablets held by the Statue of Liberty in New York Harbor: *"Give me your tired, your poor, your huddled masses yearning to breathe free, the wretched refuse of your teeming shore. Send these, the homeless, tempest-tossed to me, I lift my lamp beside the golden door!"*

In my travels with the Navy visiting ports and people of many nations, I was told countless times, "We wish we lived in America. We wish America was here." Living in the notion and motion of freedom is a gift and a blessing. We Americans have a high calling to be what the Statue of Liberty symbolizes for us to be, and what God calls us to do on this Holy Mountain of a nation called the United States of America: *"Then the Lord God will wipe away the tears from all faces, and the disgrace of his people he will take away from all the earth, for the Lord has spoken."* (Isaiah 25:8)

May you have a blessed holy day on the 4th of July, and a blessed holy summer with your country, America. Do take time to reflect on your notion and motion of freedom is for you and for your nation. Your citizenship is a gift and a blessing by Almighty God. Don't waste it.

GRILLED CHICKEN DINNER FUNDRAISER:



NEW POLICY FOR CHURCH FUNERAL DINNERS:

At its monthly meeting in March 2018, the Session adopted a new funeral lunch/dinner policy. The new policy states that there will be a \$3.00 charge per person for a funeral meal to be served to them. This charge is to take effect immediately. This charge will hopefully cover the cost of food, and paper products (e.g. napkins, plates, cups, and plastic eating utensils) used for the meal.

Also, the Session approved upon the recommendation of the church's Funeral Committee (Sharon Leach, Chair; Cindy Maher, Meal Coordinator; Kay Blessing; Bonnie Pratt; Jeff Reed) that a standardized menu be used in preparing the funeral meals. The menu will basically consist of ham and other major food dishes designated and assigned by the funeral meal coordinator, Cindy Maher, and to be cooked in the church's own kitchen. Desserts will be donated by church members and friends. Cindy Maher will contact individuals to make desserts. Hopefully, by preparing the funeral meals in the church's kitchen with a designated work crew, the church will become more efficient in utilizing its resources in the areas of manpower and kitchen facility. The purpose of this new policy is to help cover the cost of the meal, and to streamline the food preparation process. Please know that when a funeral lunch or dinner is being served in the church's fellowship hall there is a janitorial fee of \$50.00 to be paid by the family to the church.
