"Be Joyful"

The opening phrase of the 100th Psalm, "Make a joyful noise to the Lord all the earth" (v. 1), delivers a timeless message, the importance of being joyful. I remember many years ago as a little child making a small paper scroll and writing this particular verse on it. My Sunday School teacher asked the class to pick a favorite Bible verse. Not having a favorite verse and not knowing what particular verse to choose, I randomly opened the Bible, closed my eyes and let my fingers do the walking. When my fingers stopped on this biblical verse. My favorite scriptural verse came into being. Over the years, I have come to know this particular verse quite well.

These past couple of months our church's Adult Bible Study which meets on Wednesdays at noon studied the word, "joyful." It was through Paul's Letter to the Philippians that we discovered our need to be joyful and to rejoice. Paul wanted his readers to adopt a spirit of joyfulness in order to let it rule their daily lives. Paul sought to change the Philippians' perspective. He strongly believed if he could have a positive attitude in the midst of his sufferings while in prison so could the Philippians who lived and moved about freely. The whole class was awe struck by Paul's insight about letting the joyful noise of Christ rule our hearts and minds and souls. He simply said having a joyful outlook on all aspects of life despite a person's hardships and sufferings works miracles. Developing a positive attitude towards oneself in facing life's trials and tribulations is being Christ-like.

In studying Paul's Letter to the Philippians, the class used Max O. Vincent's book, "Because of This I Rejoice, Reading Philippians during Lent." This book cuts through the chase with biblical conviction about the immediate importance of people creating a joyful spirit, a joyful attitude, and a joyful life. Creating and living with a positive attitude enables us to worship the Lord with a joyful noise. I always thought I made a joyful noise to the Lord. However, after reading and studying this little book by Vincent, I discovered I still have a lot of work ahead of me in my spiritual practices to be truly joyful. Let us always be joyful in worship, because worship is the daily celebration of being joyful in our lives.


- 1. Member of the First Presbyterian Church.

NEW POLICY FOR CHURCH FUNERAL DINNERS:

At its monthly meeting in March 2018, the Session adopted a new funeral lunch/dinner policy. The new policy states that there will be a \$3.00 charge per person for a funeral meal to be served to them. This charge is to take effect immediately. This charge will hopefully cover the cost of food, and paper products (e.g. napkins, plates, cups, and plastic eating utensils) used for the meal.

Also, the Session approved upon the recommendation of the church's Funeral Committee (Sharon Leach, Chair; Cindy Maher, Meal Coordinator: Kay Blessing: Bonnie Pratt; Jeff Reed) that a standardized menu be used in preparing the funeral meals. The menu will basically consist of ham and other major food dishes designated and assigned by the funeral meal coordinator. Cindy Maher, and to be cooked in the church's own kitchen. Desserts will be donated by church members and friends. Cindy Maher will contact individuals to make desserts. Hopefully, by preparing the funeral meals in the church's kitchen with a designated work crew, the church will become more efficient in utilizing its resources in the areas of manpower and kitchen facility. The purpose of this new policy is to help cover the cost of the meal, and to streamline the food preparation process. Please know that when a funeral lunch or dinner is being served in the church's fellowship hall there is a janitorial fee of \$50.00 to be paid by the family to the church.
