

REACH OUT to Reach All

"RUMMAGE RUMBLE"

Let's rumble with our rummage and find happiness. I have to confess I don't find happiness rumbling through my rummage. With that being said, I truly don't like to look at the reality of needing to sort and let things go. Quite frankly, it is difficult, it is hard, and it is painful.

When I heard the song, "Let It Go! Let It Go!" from Walt Disney's animated musical movie, "FROZEN," I could relate to the movement and impact of the need to let things go whether it be of an emotional need or a material object because I find both intertwined with one another.

Being a collector of many objects from heavy rocks to delicate wooden acoustic musical instruments, from primitive wood carvings to bright tree bark paintings, from sticky stamps to lustrous coins, from cast iron cooking utensils to fine cut glass crystal; I like it all. You name the object and I most likely collect it in one form or another. I am wired as a collector of things, and many things at that.

So, I need to find courage to let things go. I find my source of courage by humming and singing the song, "Let It Go! Let It Go!" from "FROZEN." I find it actually works. From my numerous and countless attempts to hum and sing this "liturgical rummage song" I discover it motivates me to clear the clutter from my desk. If you don't believe me, you ought to come and visit my office and see my desk. Believe it or not, I cleared it. It is clean and neat. Now, ask me, how long did it take to clear off my desk? I am glad you ask. It took me 4 ½ years. That's right! 4 ½ years. Now my challenge is to confront the remaining parts of my office.

Another insight in doing the impossible, clearing off my desk, was to engage my brain—my thoughts—to rationalize and convince me to find happiness and joy is to let things go.

Three insightful sayings which help in rumbling through my rummage and let go are:

"The joy is not always in getting what we want but in letting go of what we don't need." (James Hewet)

"Happiness is not found in things you possess, but in what you have the courage to release." (Nathaniel Hawthorne)

"...go and sell all...and come and follow Me." (Jesus Christ, Mark 10:21)

All three quotes motivate me. Of course, the last quote inspires me comes from the story of "The Rich Young Man" (Mark 10:17-31). This story gets me all the time knowing our ultimate Christian call and priority is to follow Jesus and experience Him by picking up our cross and letting our possessions go, "Let It Go! Let It Go!"

Blessed are those who let things go. Blessed are those who struggle to find joy and happiness by rumbling through their rummage. Blessed are those who have the courage to answer the call to follow Jesus without the hesitation to go and sell all to experience Jesus and the way of the cross.

Happy are those who can call on Jesus Christ to clear the clutter from all aspects of their lives.

Let us go forth and rumble through all our physical, mental and spiritual rummage and clear the clutter away.
