"Oath of Office"

January 6th, the official day Congress counted the certified electoral votes of our nation's 50 states, including the State of Michigan, the United States Capitol building came under attack by a violent mob leading an insurrection against the government of the United States. These perpetrators' actions disrupted the 117th Congress's Constitutional mandate to formally elect our country's next - President and Vice President.

News media outlets continue to report the day's events from its many angles and perspectives, uncovering the truth of what took place in the sacred halls of Congress. The Why? What? Who? Where? When? and How? questions are being asked with our nation's law enforcement agencies arresting some of the Capitol's trespassers. Now the House of Representatives has impeached President Trump for the second time related to the grievous offense of not keeping his oath to honor, defend, and protect the U.S. Constitution. I expect Congress will censure some of its own members for their behavior of unbecoming a congressman or congresswoman.

Any person taking an oath of office, whether it be in a municipality, township, county, state, or federal government, s/he must have a strong, impeccable, moral character. There is no question about it. Honor, courage, and commitment portray a high moral character. Trusting a person's character is the cornerstone of our democracy. Without that trust, our faith in American democracy is gravely threatened. Without trust, our belief in this nation, being a Republic, will cease to exist.

What took place at the U.S. Capitol created a sense of horror within me. For the first time, I must say, I saw how vulnerable our Republic really is and how fragile democracy is. I found my unsavory revelation distasteful to the point where I wanted to throw up.

Saying or taking an oath of office is truly a tremendous undertaking of responsibility. I have taken several sacred oaths or vows in the course of my life. The first one, in 1975, when I was ordained a Deacon at my home church in Murphysboro, Illinois. The second one, in 1982, when I married Jane at her home church in Carbondale, Illinois. The third one, in 1986, when I was ordained and installed as a Minister of the Word and Sacrament in my first parish in Ewing, Nebraska. The fourth one, when I was installed as Pastor of Home Heights Presbyterian Church in 1990, St. Louis, Missouri. The fifth one, when I was installed as Pastor of the Mitchell Presbyterian Church in 1994, Granite City, Illinois. The sixth one, in 1996, when I took the oath of office to become an Officer and Chaplain in the United States Navy at the Federal Building in St. Louis, Missouri. My seventh oath of office occurred in 2017 when I was installed as the Pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of Taymouth in Birch Run, Michigan.

All seven oaths or vows were completed in a sacred and holy manner. All seven oaths were witnessed by a community where responsibility and accountability are held in high esteem. The same holds true for all who have become ordained/installed Deacons or Elders of the First Presbyterian Church of Taymouth. The same is true when a person joins our church, as well as those who take their marriage vows before the eyes of God. We take our oaths of office seriously as Presbyterians, as Christians, as Americans.

Although I am a retired U.S. Naval Officer, I am still obligated to uphold and protect the U.S. Constitution, a governing principle written as a document, from all domestic and foreign enemies. Such responsibility and accountability are not taken lightly but reverently and deliberately. The same holds true with my ordination vows as a Pastor of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) to support and uphold our denomination's Constitution as written in <u>The Book of Order</u> and in <u>The Book of Confessions</u>. There is no higher or sacred calling than being a disciple of Jesus Christ. Jesus gives us the direction and instruction to be faithful disciples following His lead in being the Way, the Truth, and the Life—Being the Church.

I pray and hope our 117th Congress and our 45th President develop repentant hearts and take their oaths of office seriously for the benefit of all U.S. citizens and the glory of God.

In January for the days of Epiphany, we did a "Penny War". Funds from this were divided 50-50 between Brian House and our church. October we collected funds for "One Great Hour of Sharing". The following items were discussed and approved at the December 2020 and January 2021 Session Meetings.

Session Meeting: December 8, 2020

- ♦ Gary Brabant was trying to get a hold of the tree trimmers.
- ♦ The budget was discussed for 2021. The contribution budget needs to be looked at as a goal for the year. The staff was given a 4% raise.
- ♦ Accepted introduction of Adopt-A-Bill. Members can put their money in a specific place if they wish. They can take a bill for 1, 3, or 6 month increments. There will be more information made available by the finance committee.

- ♦ Missions gave \$400 to One Great Hour of Sharing as planned. The other four donations and they had planned to make, they cut the original requested amount in half.
- ⇒Women at Risk (WAR) received \$250 Amazing Grace Animal Rescue, Healthsource of Saginaw and Mustard Seed shelter received \$200 each.
- ⇒23 shoe boxes were wrapped this year and Kathy Rogers delivered them. There is currently nothing planned for 2021 at this time. In 2020, Missions raised \$1,427.64. This is the lowest amount raised in the last four years due to the pandemic.
- ♦ Taping of the Christmas program began on December 5, 2020 and will continue on December 13, 2020. The plan is to show/upload the program on December 20, 2020.
- ♦ Member Care put up 1 Corinthians Bible verse and hearts all over the west door.
- ♦ Christmas Eve service will be virtual on December 24, 2020, at 5:00 p.m. Charlotte Needham will be the soloist. Christmas Eve bonfire service will take place on December 24, 2020, at 8:00 p.m.
- ♦ Discussed Annual congregational meeting being postponed until February 2021.

Session Meeting: January 12, 2021

- ♦ Pastor received an email from Rick and Lynn Hauk. They have requested to reactivate their membership.
- ♦ The tree trimming has been done. Ideas for a stump carving will be discussed at the congregational meeting.
- ♦ Per Capita numbers reported to the General Assembly incorrectly in 2019. This made the numbers off in 2020 as well. They will be corrected when statistics are sent over in February 2021; so going forward really paying the correct Per Capita amount.
- ♦ It was approved that we will be back in church beginning on February 7, 2021, following all social distancing policies that are currently in place.
- ♦ Congregational meeting has been approved to be on February 28th, 2021 immediately following the church service.
