"Through the Looking Glass"

The one thing I have to say about the manse's custom, built in, television screen called the family room sliding door with its panoramic view facing east towards the back yard and the alfalfa field, is that it's "Spectacular"! Spectacular in the sense I can watch deer, rabbits, squirrels, and birds congregate in the backyard and the alfalfa field. I am looking forward to seeing nature's fall colors in the trees' leaves. I notice some trees are beginning to lose their dark green foliage. Some leaves appear lighter in color. Fall is just around the corner soon to be followed by the cold whiteness of frozen rain. As I imagine the fall and wintry landscape of the backyard, the field, and the tree line bordering the eastern edge of the field, I observe in my mind how human nature changes when it needs to change.

This pandemic enables me to sit in front of my family room sliding door and think. Thinking about all the stuff that is happening to our nation and even to our church. I clean my rosy color glass door and recognize what this pandemic allows me to see. Our nation faces many social ills and our church needs to be part of the solution and not part of the problem. I am hopeful our church will be a leader in resolving community issues. I know it won't be easy. It will take courage. It takes me courage to look at myself and recognize my ineffectiveness in changing the world, or at least America. Looking through my sliding door, I reflect how many times I was not fully effective in creating societal change. I was not heard. I didn't speak effectively. I remained silent when I should have spoken. There are times I lost courage to say something, or I was afraid to say something due to what could negatively affect me. I expect some of you may have felt this from time to time when trying to create change for the better.

One thing I have discovered about courage is I can't look at courage behind closed glass doors, I must open the sliding doors and walk into the back yard, walk across the field, and walk into the unknown timberline to actively engage in God's world. Crying out for social change takes courage which comes in the magic formula of numbers: "...where two or three are gathered there I am also..." (Matthew 18:19-20). Change cannot take place without God, nor without us—God's people—the Church, because we are the presence of Jesus Christ in this world. Jesus Christ depends upon us as agents of change including our small acreage of land called Taymouth Presbyterian. Much of our country's behavior and morals lack the teachings of Jesus who tells us to be Love Incarnate—The Golden Rule—"Do unto others as you would have them do unto you," (Matthew 7:12; Luke 6:31). Being Love Incarnate is our Christian divine calling here at Taymouth Presbyterian Church. Let us walk with Jesus Christ in real time knowing we can change the world by acknowledging ourselves as effective agents of change in the very real presence of Jesus Christ.

The following items were discussed and approved at August's Session meeting.

- PW will not have a rummage sale this year.

- Harvest Supper postponed until 2021.

Yarn and Thread has supported McLaren Hospital in Bay City for the last seven years. Our prayer shawls comforted moms who lost babies. Our Moses Baskets and preemie blankets wrapped babies born too soon in love.

In December 2019, the hospital conducted a memorial service "Previous Reflections", and gave out 684 of our handmade ornaments. To date, 4,925 newborn heads have been kept warm in our hats!

Since February of this year, Yarn and Thread has been discerning whether or not to seek a new mission in our community of need. God answered our prayers and has opened a new door. Old Town Christian Outreach in Saginaw needs hats! They are "feet on the ground" type of ministry serving the community. They can use hats for babies, toddlers, children, women, and men. One hat can really change a life if your head is cold. These hats can be crocheted, knitted, or made on a loom. They don't have to be complicated, just warm. I am up for this mission of joy, will you help?

Stewardship

Per Capita. Not something we all like to think about but a very important responsibility as a member of our church. Per Capita has been a part of our funding history for over 150 years. When Presbyteries, Synods, and the General Assembly meet, they are conducting the legislative and judicial business of the church. Per capita is used to fund these governing councils that represent us. The whole church shares in this expense since everyone who is a member shares in the benefits of this system of church government. Per capita provides for the financial participation of all local churches, thus providing for unity and mutual responsibility within the church.

The Per Capita cost per member is \$29.00. As of August, we have collected \$1995.00. Our total cost due is \$3944.00. Within the last four months of the year, the remaining balance will be divided into equal payments of \$487.25. If you have already paid your Per Capita-Thank you! If you haven't been able to pay yet, there is still time. Please prayerfully consider sending in your \$29.00 before the end of the year.

SERVICES ARE OUTSIDE FOR AS LONG AS WEATHER PERMITS.

In the event of inclement weather, services will be indoors with masks, and social distancing.

Virtual Worship by way of video or live-streaming will continue to take place to ensure those who choose to remain home will have a meaningful worship experience.

Those who remain home may receive a telephone call from a Session Elder in order to remain connected to the congregation.

What We CANNOT Do

We cannot guarantee that there will be no one present who has the virus.

We cannot guarantee that the COVID-19 virus will not be present in the church.

All people who attend public worship outdoors or indoors do so knowing that that there is a risk of contracting the virus.

WHAT WE NEED YOU TO DO

STAY HOME if you are high-risk or in any way think you have the virus or were exposed to it.

Services are planned to last between 30-40 minutes. You may remain in your vehicle during the worship service, or sit on the lawn with a mask.

If you do depart your car, you are asked to wear a mask and maintain a six-foot distance.

The east doors of the church building (location: the elevator entrance) will be open for bathroom usage only.

Please immediately return to your vehicle after using the bathroom.

- Feel sick or ill on any Sunday morning,

Outdoor Service Format

Church services will take place outdoors on the South lawn.

Upon arrival at church, we ask that you will either pull into the front row reserved for those watching from their car, or pull into the second row for those planning to watch from the lawn.

If pulled into the front to watch from your car, we ask you pull in square to the grass regardless of the parking lot's lines

An usher will greet you with a prepackaged Ziploc bag with worship items: a bulletin; a prayer card; and offering envelope (if needed in case you didn't bring your own). Please prepare these items so they can be collected during the service at the designated times by ushers.

Indoor Service Format

Upon arrival to church depending on preference and total attendance, you will be ushered either upstairs to the Sanctuary or downstairs to the Fellowship Hall.

Upstairs, every other pew is marked off to ensure social distancing, and downstairs, tables are spaced to ensure social distancing.

An usher will greet you with a prepackaged Ziploc bag with worship items: a bulletin; a prayer card; and offering envelope (if needed in case you didn't bring your own). Please prepare these items so they can be collected during the service at the designated times by ushers.

After the service we ask that you wait to be dismissed.
