
"Day of Pentecost"

On Sunday, May 19th, we will celebrate Pentecost (Acts 2:1-21) with the liturgical color of red. I would like to share with you in this brief article the meaning of Pentecost as written in our denomination's liturgical worship book, the Book of Common Worship (2018). I hope you find this information insightful about the importance and significance of Pentecost. What follows is the two-paragraph text copied word for word describing the Day of Pentecost (Book of Common Worship, 2018, p. 344) prepared by the Office of Theology and Worship for the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.):

"Pentecost" comes from a Greek word meaning fiftieth day. On this day, the Holy Spirit came with wind and flame, empowering the disciples to proclaim the good news of the risen Lord to all people. Falling on the fiftieth day of the season Easter, Pentecost represents the culmination of the church's seven-week celebration of Christ's resurrection. As the Lord's Day is sometimes called the "eighth day" of creation, Pentecost is a day of new creation—all things transformed and made new by the Word and Breath of the living God. On the Day of Pentecost, we give particular thanks for the gift of God's Holy Spirit, who gathers the church as the body of Christ and sends us to share in Christ's mission throughout the world.

The notion of Easter as a season of fifty days is patterned after the ancient Jewish period of seven weeks that extended from the beginning of the barley harvest, after Passover, to the end of the wheat harvest the Festival of Weeks (in Hebrew, Shavuot). In Jewish tradition, Shavuot, also marks the giving of the law to Moses at Sinai, a connection that may inform Paul's discussion of the law and the Spirit.


