These past weeks conducting our church's ministry has been different to say the least. Different that is in a positive way. Although we have not been able to come together physically to worship, we have been able to come together to worship virtually and by way of telephone. Christine Callender, our Clerk of Session and the Chair of our Social Media and Communication Outreach Committee, has been at the tip of the spear making a point to ensure our Facebook/YouTube worship services are recorded and uploaded for all of us to see. Along with Christine's leadership there are several other people supporting her as the shaft of the spear; Sarah Schriber, our new Church Secretary, and Heidi Smith, our Church Musician. I want to thank Christine, Sarah, and Heidi for doing a great job! On the same note I want to thank our past weeks' singers such as Ally Calendar, Adam and Heidi Smith, Ken and Kathy Maurer, Paul Fortier, and Charlotte Needham. They have been wonderful in coming to the church to be video-taped. For those who may not know it takes Christine nearly 12 hours to complete a virtual worship service from beginning to end. This includes the actual taping, • editing the video, and uploading the finished product on Facebook/YouTube. I want to extend a big "Thank you!" to Christine and all those who I have mentioned for making virtual worship possible. In the same way I want to extend my great appreciation and thank you to all our Elders on Session, and to Dawn Patrick, our Church Financial Secretary and Christian Education Director, for taking their time and energy in calling our church members each Sunday.

Since we have last met in worship our church has obtained the social telecommunication media platform called "ZOOM," so we can conduct meetings and small group gatherings by way of teleconferencing. Social and physical distancing requirements have made it impossible for us to conduct face-to-face business. The Session and the church staff have used the personal computer (i.e. email) and telephone to communicate and conduct business, but we have not been able to do it face-to-face where everyone can talk with one another at one time. The "ZOOM" social media platform enables us to do just that while maintaining geographical distance. The Session meeting on Tuesday, May 5th, was the first time we implemented this new social media program. Another technological advance is the establishment of our "On-Line Giving." Ever since we started accepting credit cards purchasing meals for our church's Fall Harvest Supper and Spring Fish Fry, Tiffany Fortier, Chair of the Finance Committee, and Dawn Patrick have been exploring and working on ways to get this new aspect of stewardship up and running. We are closer than ever seeing this happen. I expect the month of May will be the birth of this new strategy.

I feel like our church is beginning to live out Captain Kirk's opening lines of the old television show, Star Trek. I even hear myself saying, "Virtual Church Ministry: The Final Frontier." These are the voyages of the Starship Taymouth Presbyterian Church. Its five year mission to explore strange new ways of conducting virtual ministry, to seek out new virtual missions and disciples. To boldly go where no Church, The Body of Christ, has gone before." Today, we are only scratching the surface of what it means to be the Virtual Church. Truly, this is a new frontier in how we can and are to conduct ministry, especially, in the midst of a pandemic called COVID-19. Like many new and great discoveries of the 21st Century, sometimes it takes a crisis to motivate people to do new and different things. Currently, we are seeing this today on so many fronts in both the physical and virtual worlds. May we continue to be at the tip of the spear going boldly where no church has gone before. The Finance department has been very busy the past few weeks! We have been diligently investigating all ideas, suggestions, and opportunities for monetarily supporting the church. Two options have been acted upon to help us. The first one is a waiver granted to the church through the Board of Pensions. The Board will waive the church's obligation to pay the Pastor's Participation dues for three months as a credit. There will not be any lapse in benefits or any requirement to pay back the three months waived. The second option is a loan through the State Bank and the Paycheck Protection Program offered in the government stimulus. The loan amount will be for \$6,358.00 and is to be used for payroll or utilities. It is a very generous loan in that we will not need to pay anything back as long as the funds are used properly. If the funds are not completely exhausted on payroll, etc., then the unused amount is given back to the bank. Session approved the action of accepting this loan at the meeting held via Zoom on Tuesday, May 5.

While these two options will certainly help, it is YOUR generous giving that will sustain us. Nothing can replace the time we can come together to worship, but we will remain here to serve you and our Lord! Please continue to keep the church in your prayers as we navigate through this time! Contributions can be made by mail, drop-off in the prayer box at the South entrance of the church, or with the new on-line giving (see below). Deposits are currently processed twice a month.
