"Let's Take a Look"

Have you noticed there has been a slight change to one of our fixtures in the sanctuary? (Clue: It is not a light fixture.) You may have noticed it and kept silent about it. You may have looked at it and never recognized the slight change. The change occurred a few months ago with a simple repair. The small repair refashioned the piece to look normal.

Is your curiosity up? If so, I invite you to search the sanctuary. Searching for things can be exciting and fun. I like the notion of going on a quest to discover new things, to seek old things, and to experience the search itself. I see this readily happening with our Sunday School children "looking for Jesus" on Sunday mornings during Sunday School. It is a wonderful sight to watch the joy of their search.

The same holds true with our customers (including me) who come shopping at our church's rummage sale. Shopping for me is a form of therapy, because it involves the process of searching for something. For some people shopping creates anxiety. For others, shopping reduces anxiety. "Shopping therapy" with the notion of "seek and you will find" (Mt. 7:7) is a process of discovery.

Jesus of Nazareth, our Lord and Savior, mentions in his parables (Lk. 15:3-10) how the Kingdom of God is perceived upon peoples' search for God and their desire to know God. Searching for that ultimate divine relationship between ourselves and God creates meaning. Meaning enables us to see Jesus as the Way, the Truth, and the Life (Jn. 14:6).

Opening our eyes to see Jesus is to see change taking place. Opening our eyes to see change taking place is to feel the Holy Spirit moving us and leading us towards the search for Jesus and our search for ultimate meaning. I hope you take up my invitation of searching for the item which has changed. A sleuth

adventure awaits.
