"Flower Garden Summer School"

Observing the growing of mustard seed plants in the church's flower garden this summer has been a true blessing. The goal of planting tiny mustard seeds on Father's Day with the children during the worship hour was to talk about the meaning of the "Parable of the Mustard Seed" (Matt. 13:31-32; Mark 4:30-32; Luke 13:18-19). Within those few minutes of planting the mustard seeds we talked about how religious faith is like a mustard seed (Matt. 17:20; Luke 17:5-6), and how we need to be hopeful and trusting in God to help us grow in our Christian faith. The children summed up their sense of hope and trust in God by planting and scattering more mustard seeds in the garden. I can somewhat relate to their perspective and concept of "more".

Watching the children joyfully scatter mustard seeds across the ground in the flowerbeds and covering them up with their hands, they became active participants in another one of Jesus' parables, "The Parable of the Sower," (Matt. 13:18-23, Mark 4:13-20, and Luke 8:11-15). I took great comfort in those few minutes watching and listening to the children teach me what having faith is like.

Yes, I must say I had my doubts about whether or not the mustard seeds would germinate. And despite the many seeds scattered and planted, I feared not one plant would come up and grow. Lo and behold, over the next several weeks, not just one plant, but MANY mustard plants sprouted and matured developing their own pods of mustard seeds.

Jesus readily describes the Kingdom of God or the Kingdom of Heaven in all sorts of parables. The Mustard Seed Parable is just one depicting God's Heavenly Kingdom on Earth as a place where people are fed and cured. Besides the mustard seed being an expression of faith, it is a medicinal plant with healing properties, and it is a culinary plant seasoning food. According to ancient Greek and Roman his-

torians and philosophers, the curative aspects of mustard seed include clearing out phlegm in the throat, helping with decongestion of the nasal/sinus passages, alleviating toothaches, soothing stomach aches, relaxing the bowels to obtain regularity, promoting menstruation and urine, and with a vinegar additive, making a paste to help in curing snake bites and scorpion stings. (Bernard Brandon Scott, <u>Hear Then the Parable</u>, p.380, Fortress Press, 1989)

Of course, without it ever being theologically expressed or stated, "The Kingdom of God is like a paste of mustard seeds spread on a hot dog." Bon Appetite!

BUILDING & GROUNDS


- Thank you to the people helping clean the church– looking for more helpers.

Some of the agencies that receive the shoeboxes are: The Salvation Army, Emmaus House, East Side Soup Kitchen, McNally House, Ascension House (Emerson House), Rescue Mission, Underground Railroad and many others.

PLEASE NOTE: THE TOPS OF THE BOXES NEED TO CLOSE. YOU ARE ALL SO GENEROUS WITH LOTS OF WONDERFUL ITEMS, BUT WE NEED TO BE ABLE TO CLOSE THE BOX AND WRAP IT.

What you pack into your shoebox can be as unique as you are but please make sure the items are NEW and have some gift appeal to them. NO PERSONAL HYGIENE ITEMS. AVOID BULKY ITEMS SUCH AS SHAWLS OR TOWELS. Here is a list that will help you. Do Not feel that you have to provide all of these items. Some suggestions for the shoebox: full size bottle of shampoo, brush, comb, toothbrush & paste, deodorant, nail file, perfume, lotion, watch, small notebook & pen, book, hat, gloves, socks, non-perishable candy, small sewing kit, calendar, Kleenex, coin purse, bracelet, scarf.

The deadline for shoeboxes will be Nov. 27th. Do not wrap the box. Mission Committee will do the wrapping.
