Welcome Back!

I want to welcome everyone back! This newsletter issue contains information about what we need and should do as we physically come together as a family of God. We will need to observe the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines and recommendations such as washing hands, using hand sanitizer, keeping social distancing, wearing face masks.

Presently, our Governor is allowing social groups of 100 people or fewer to gather outdoors. The Session believes it is safe to conduct outside worship services. The Session will evaluate indoor worship services when the CDC's Phase 1 ends, which currently recommends only ten or fewer people to gather indoors socially. Once the Governor in her reopening phases begins to allow, social gatherings reflecting CDC's Phase 2 where 50 or fewer people can gather together indoors, then worship inside the church becomes a probability. The Session is currently obtaining new technology to live-feed worship between the sanctuary and fellowship hall to accommodate the number of people attending while maintaining social distancing. The live-feed technology will enable the church to live-stream worship abroad by way of Facebook and YouTube.

We look forward to seeing you at our outdoor worship service on Sunday, July 5th, at 9:30 a.m. Shalom,

"A Green Thumb Church"

A few weeks ago, I received some small trees from Nancy Schriber so I could "bonsai" them in the future. A hobby of mine is creating and growing bonsai trees. Bonsai is the art of potting, growing, and styling miniature size trees to resemble those found in nature. I have tried this before a couple of years ago with John Miller's gift of small trees. Unfortunately, my black thumb got in the way. The same black thumb put to death a small tree that Betty Dudek gave me to bonsai three years ago. I am praying I don't do the same with my new batch of trees. This batch of new trees from Nancy consists of two Japanese maples, three Michigan white pine trees, and several indigenous maple and oak trees. Wish me luck. I need it.

Bonsai is nothing new for me. When Jane and I lived in California, we were able to grow and maintain several bonsai trees from a number of different tree and bush species. We both found it fun and enjoyable to shape things. Shaping nature is something humankind has been doing ever since our birth by God. Remember the Garden of Eden story (Genesis 2 & 3) and how our free will (disobedience) shaped our destiny to live outside of God's beautiful garden? Ever since our expulsion from the Garden of Eden, we humans have been trying to shape and reshape God's sacred garden back into our lives. Last year, Jane and I visited two beautiful, world-renowned, Michigan gardens: The Frederik Meijer Gardens and Sculpture Park in Grand Rapids, and the Japanese Tea Garden in Saginaw. Both gardens reflect humanity's divine image of creativity (Genesis 1:26-27).

The power of human creativity involves shaping and reshaping nature into gardens or placing trees into small pots. Either way, by being made in God's divine image, we are blessed with the act of creativity, including the power of new ways of thinking. Just as the pandemic has shaped our lives to observe social isolation and social distancing, we have the ability to reshape our thinking and perspective towards a new attitude of what it means to live in a new norm. Shaping our response helps reduce other people's anxiety and fear. We are putting into action what Jesus calls the Golden Rule (Matthew 7:12). Yes, by following the Golden Rule and thinking of others, we all can overcome our fear.

Let us continue growing our church with a green thumb. Our church's memorial gardens and flowerbeds reflect God's living creativity. Let us do the same when we gather together as a church family.

What We CANNOT Do

We cannot guarantee that there will be no one present who has the virus.

WHAT WE NEED YOU TO DO

STAY HOME if you are high-risk or in any way think you have the virus or were exposed to it.

Remain in your vehicle during the duration of the worship service, which is planned to last between 30-40 minutes.

The east doors of the church building (location: the elevator entrance) will be open for bathroom usage only.

If you do depart your car to use the bathroom (or for any reason), you are asked to wear a mask and maintain a six-foot distance.

Please immediately return to your vehicle after using the bathroom.

PLEASE STAY HOME IF YOU ...

- Have the virus or might have been exposed to the virus
- Feel sick or ill on any Sunday morning,
- Are At high-risk if you contract COVID-19

Outdoor Service Format

Church services will take place outdoors at 9:30 a.m. in the format of "Drive-In" worship. Drive-in worship is just that worshipping God inside your vehicle while the service is being broadcast over a public address system. Upon arrival at church, you will pull into the parking lot guided by an attendant to a spot facing the church's south lawn.

An usher will greet you with a prepackaged Ziploc bag with all the worship items you need, including a bulletin, an attendance card, a prayer card, an offering envelope (if needed in case you didn't bring your own), and evaluation form.

Please fill out the attendance card and prayer card, and place offering in the small Ziploc bag. These items will then be collected by the returning usher.

Evaluation forms can be mailed to the church.

Session will assess and evaluate the "Drive-In" worship format at its August 11th meeting, and make changes accordingly.
