CHURCH MEMBERSHIP



DIVINE MOTHERHOOD

The best depiction of an entity imparting divine wisdom is the silhouette of a mother holding a steaming hot tea cup or a coffee cup to her lips and looking at her child. Not a word said. Only the look. Divine wisdom is found in the look alone. A mother's look alone is a thousand sacred words multiplied by all infinity. This is divine wisdom. This is divine motherhood. This is God being present.

Women define what love is. Women perceive the embodiment of God's motherhood in the flow of life. Women are the sacred entity giving birth to love. Let us be thankful for the touch of a mother's love. Let us be thankful for the touch of any woman's love who embraces us as parent, spouse, child, and friend.

Mother's Day is a day to recognize all women who are the embodiment of God's divine wisdom. Mother's Day is our opportunity to contemplate God's motherly traits. God's feminine side is often depicted in words like care, comfort, and protection:

"How often have I desired to gather your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing." (Matthew 23:37)

"I will fall upon them like a bear robbed of her cubs, and will tear open the covering of the heart." (Hosea 13:8)

"As an eagle stirs up its nest, and hovers over its young; as it spreads its wings, takes them up, and bears them a loft on its pinions..." (Deuteronomy 32:11)

Yes, God cares, comforts, and protects us. God always wants us to have the best in our lives.

God's best I discover is found through God's feminine side, a feminine principle called "Wisdom." In the Bible, wisdom is identified as a female noun. The Book of Proverbs personifies divine wisdom as that entity which existed before the world was made, it revealed God, and acted as God's agent in creation (Proverbs 8:22-31). Wisdom indeed dwells with God. It is God's motherly wisdom which invites us all to come to her table for a cup of hot tea and coffee, and of course, a bite to eat (Proverbs 9:1-12). The gift of wisdom is God's motherly love given to her children, you and me, and the whole world.

Let us be thankful for all the women in our lives who brings God's divine motherhood to light in holding a cup of hot brew to their lips while looking at us with care and compassion.

Now, I have always preferred my hot brew to be black, neither to be shaken or stirred; however, I have discovered God likes to shake and stir my steaming brews from time to time, especially, with the silent look. No words. Just the look.
