"Look Around and Give Thanks"

"Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplications with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God" (Philippians 4:6)

Give thanks to God in all circumstances. This includes giving thanks to God for the food we eat (Romans 14), for being delivered from the snares of death (II Corinthians 1), for being called into the Body of Christ (Colossians 3), for all humanity, especially, those in positions of rule and authority (I Timothy 2). The Apostle Paul indeed wants us to express our thanks fully to God.

What are we thankful for? Many years ago I came across a newspaper article entitled, "Look Around and Give Thanks," which I would like to share with you. The newspaper source and date are unknown. The article reads:

Joe grumbled as the alarm clock roused him from sleep in a comfortable bed. He made his way to the kitchen, stopping to turn the thermostat up to take the chill off the house. His wife and children were still peacefully asleep. Joe turned on the electric coffee maker and poured himself a glass of

orange juice. He unbolted the front door and retrieved the newspaper from the drive way. Joe poured himself coffee and turned on the radio to hear the news. It was Sunday morning, so Joe's family got a little extra sleep.

Sunday morning meant breakfast with the family. It was a hearty bacon and eggs meal, followed by the usual hassle for space in the bathroom and complaints about who used the most hot water. They all chose clothing from their ample closets.

In a short time, the family was loaded in the car and off to church. Joe and his wife went to the adult study class and the kids to their groups. Worship for the family followed. They prayed, sang songs of praise, listened to the Bible reading and proclamation from God's Word.

Pretty typical American Sunday you say. Nothing—unusual here. Look again! How many blessings did Joe and his family enjoy on the typical day? This "normal" routine is a parade of small miracles. The house which he owns, a comfortable bed, ample food, clean water, the unviolated privacy of the home, a newspaper which is free to print anything, a radio newscast with no censorship, an automobile, freedom to read and study the Bible, unlimited freedom of worship and assembly, a place to eat, a television broadcast without interference from the government, plenty of good clothing, and work at a job of his choice.

If you think there is nothing very special about all this, think again. All are the stuff of mere dreams for hundreds of millions of people on this planet.

Most of all, Joe and his family have heard and accepted the good news of Jesus Christ. It never occurs to them that they are in the minority of the world's population who have never had that privilege.

It is a Season of Thanksgiving. Look around and give thanks.

- Session Education presented by Rev.
 Kroener on "A Monthly Series for Serving
 Faithfully, regarding ruling elders. "I Shall Not
 Want". Redefining stewardship for a
 congregation typically does not occur
 overnight. Break the ties of fear and scarcity.
 Note the tense of Psalm 23. The Lord is my
 shepherd. I shall not want. He leads. He
 prepares. These are words that speak of a
 present-tense God, a God of the here and
 now.
- Member Excused: Bonnie Pratt. Quorum was present. Present also Dawn Patrick, Financial Secretary.
- Approved minutes of the September 10, 2019 regular stated session meeting.
- Treasurers report was explained by Tiffany Fortier and the problems that are generated when not using a fiscal accounting year – January thru December.
- Budget is generated using 12 months-fiscal year and needs to use the 12-month period when building budget, so dollar amounts are correct.
- Unanimous decision was made not to present budget at the annual meeting in November. Budget will be presented in January 2020 for fiscal year 2020.
- Accepted Treasurers report with a deficit of \$8,271.43.
- Reviewed list of members who have not been active or contributing financially to the church. Letter to be mailed to those whose membership status has changed from active to inactive.
- Buildings and Grounds: Lights have been ordered for outside area. Thank you to those who have helped to keep the outside yard/premises looking refreshed. Thank you to those who helped Paul polish the fellowship hall floor. We can be proud of what our facilities look like year around.
- Mission: Items delivered to Mustard Seed House. They will be starting construction on a new addition to the shelter. Baby Pantry donation request taking place this month. VA Hospital month of October. Shoeboxes in November and our popular Cookie Walk and Holiday Treats, December 21. Received Thank you from Kim Weston for \$200.00 towards her Mission trip. Thank you to everyone who took part in the annual rummage sale both set up/clean up, etc.

- Christian Education: Bay Shore Presbytery
 Wide Retreat attended by Regan and Jack
 Kribs. Sharon Peters was a chaperon and
 Pastor Scott a leader. Fall Festival returning,
 October 27. Youth hosting pancake
 breakfast, December 22. Sunday School
 began on Sept. 8 and will continue Sunday
 morning following church service.
- Worship: Would like to schedule music concerts and ways to raise money discussed. Possibly promote a Christian music dinner concert. Average September attendance 73. Participants for Communion in September 65 and October 70. Discussed ways to learn the hymn of the month. Discussed ways to use Elders and Lay Leaders in Sunday Worship.
- Personnel: Reviewed Pastor terms of call and employee wage recommendation.
 Pastor and Dawn left room, Sharon Leach, Clerk proceeded as Moderator and Christine Callender assumed duties of Clerk.
- Committee recommended that the Pastors call for year 2020, remain the same as in 2019. Employees could receive up to a 2% raise after the review of the budget at year end.
- Request that Financial Secretary and Christian Education Director be allocated as one job for pay/budget purposes. Committee recommends that job stay separated for pay and job purposes.
- Member Care: Preparing for annual meeting brunch. Brunch to be served following church service
- Social Media & Communication Outreach. Repeater worked excellent for Harvest Supper.
- Youth Group will host pancake breakfast following Children's Christmas Program on December 22.
- Funeral Committee has added relish tray or vegetable tray to its menu for funeral dinners.
- Emergency & Planning Committee: Needs to have a follow up meeting on how the Emergency/Disaster Planning is going to come together for implementation in January 2020.


HEAVENLY HOPE INTERNATIONAL MISSION


