"A Sabbath Healing"



In the Gospel of Mark (3:1-6), there is a story about Jesus healing a man with a withered hand. The healing story takes place on the Sabbath. Jesus infuriates the Jewish authorities to no end, because he broke the Jewish law of working on the Sabbath. I am glad Jesus broke the law. His healing action basically changed many cultural attitudes and priorities when it comes to helping and caring for people who are in desperate need. Jesus always addressed human needs whether the needs were physical, emotional, or spiritual. This past Sunday, August 26th, Jesus addressed a particular need of mine.

I may not have had a withered hand like the man healed by Jesus on the Sabbath; however, I did have an infected, angry "withered" gallbladder that needed to be removed from my body so I could be healed. Emergency surgery was in order and it took place during our worship hour this past Sunday morning. I experienced the healing touch of Jesus by way of the surgeon's hands. The surgeon followed the example of Jesus and healed a man with a "withered" gallbladder on the Sabbath.

In our current 24 hours/7 days a week work society we sometimes forget what Jesus was trying to explain to his own cultural society about what a restricted holy day of rest meant, that being, regardless whether we work, play, or rest, we need to be sensitive to people's needs spiritually, emotionally, and physically. The key is being a good neighbor like the Good Samaritan in the Gospel of Luke. I am thankful to all people who respond 24/7 to meet people's needs.


5K COLOR RUN/WALK: CANCELLED.

On Wednesday the 29th 2018 at 11:15 a.m., Robert T. Fedder. Was called home to be home with our Lord, with Chris his loving wife by his side. If you knew Bob you would never forget him, from the meat market he ran and then catering business, and always helping out around the church. From singing in the choir, to helping with the fish fries, to the harvest supper. He helped upgrade our kitchen through the years, to our current kitchen we have today. I remember working at the catering company and Bob come storming in he had just come from the church where a bunch of people were working on cleaning up the church or some other project, what ever it was, it really was not supposed to take too long to do. So, no one thought to have lunch brought in. "We got to make these people lunch", so we whipped up a roster full of sloppy joes. Within an hour he was back over to the church with the sloppy joes, buns, chips, and lemonade. That is just one story I will never forget.

Bob and Chris gave me my first job, which turned out to be a whole lot more. They became my family as well. They became Mom and Dad and they referred to me as son. I worked for them about a total of 25 years right up until the end when Bob's health got too bad that they had to move to Virginia so their daughter Heidi could help take care of Bob. A Memorial service was held for Bob on September 8, 2018 at Salem United Methodist Church, Gloucaster, VA. Bob's cremains were buried.

NEW POLICY FOR CHURCH FUNERAL DINNERS

At its monthly meeting in March, the Session adopted a new funeral lunch/dinner policy. The new policy states that there will be a \$3.00 charge per person for a funeral meal to be served to them. This charge is to take effect immediately. This charge will hopefully cover the cost of food, and paper products (e.g. napkins, plates, cups, and plastic eating utensils) used for the meal.

Also, the Session approved upon the recommendation of the church's Funeral Committee (Sharon Leach, Chair; Cindy Maher, Meal Coordinator; Kay Blessing; Bonnie Pratt; Jeff Reed) that a standardized menu be used in preparing the funeral meals. The menu will basically consist of ham and other major food dishes designated and assigned by the funeral meal coordinator, Cindy Maher, and to be cooked in the church's own kitchen. Desserts will be donated by church members and friends. Cindy Maher will contact individuals to make desserts. Hopefully, by preparing the funeral meals in the church's kitchen with a designated work crew, the church will become more efficient in utilizing its resources in the areas of manpower and kitchen facility.

The purpose of this new policy is to help cover the cost of the meal, and to streamline the food preparation process.

Please know that when a funeral lunch or dinner is being served in the church's fellowship hall there is a janitorial fee of \$50.00 to be paid by the family to the church.

ABOUT CHURCH MEMBERSHIP



We have several needs each Sunday morning. Throughout the year we are in need of the following:


<u>Ushers</u>: If you haven't ushered before but would like to help, let the office know and we'll pair you up with someone who has done it before.
