

MISSIONS

Women at Risk, May 4, 2024— Kathy Rogers has been the contact person for our church with WAR. Items to be sold were delivered to her home. The sale began May 4 from 10 am to 1 pm. Set up was the day before on May 3 at 4 pm. Members removed items from plastic bags. Jewelry such as pins, earrings, bracelets, necklaces, and key chains were set out on colored table cloths. Beautiful scarfs were displayed while ornaments were placed on a wire tree sparkling to catch one's eye for Christmas Decorations. Children's items were place on one table such at stuffed animals, little bags or pursees.

Many thanks to Kathy Maurer and Janette Gonzales that took care of the purchases, accounting such as taxes, etc. The square was used to record credit card sales. The amount goes directly to WAR. We do not make money off this event. However, it is a very worthwhile organization as it rescues women from horrific situations. Each customer filled out an order form with name, address, phone, and email, hostess (TPC), and date. For each item sold, the price tag is removed and placed on the form. Donations are kept separate so tax is not included.

The total number of items sold was \$1,110.83. A great big thank you to all who worked on the sale and those who made purchase to make our event a success.

"Big Heart Farms...Where God's Fruit Grows!"

These past months I have come to know what the fruit of the Spirit is and is not. Our Sunday School children on Youth Sunday, sang a song, "Fruit of the Spirit," telling us the fruit of the Spirit is not coconuts, bananas, watermelons, lemons, cherries, grapes, oranges, strawberries, pears, apples, or pineapples. Rather, the Spirit's fruit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. (Galatians 5:22-23)

Also, as dramatized by our church's puppet ministry, I have come to understand the essence of what it means to live out or to live by the Spirit's fruit from Farmer Brown, Farmer Dan, and their fellow farmers on Big Heart Farms such as Farmer Stingy, Farmer Grumpy, Farmer Worry, Farmer Mean, Farmer Unfaithful, Farmer Harsh, Farmer Hungry, Farmer Impatient. As Farmer Brown said at the conclusion of the play, "All a person needs to do is to act like Jesus."

I must say, it is not always easy to act like Jesus, and yet we are asked to do so. God wants us to portray and depict a Christ-like persona. I can relate to all the different farmers' personas working on Big Heart Farms. There are times I possess the best of what Farmers Brown and Dan tells us to do—be like Jesus; and yet, Farmers Stingy, Grumpy, Worry, Mean, Unfaithful, Harsh, Hungry, and Impatient enter my thoughts and get the better of me.

Sadly, this is a constant battle within me. Some days are better than others. I have discovered no one is perfect. Yet, as I mature in my faith walk recognizing my imperfections towards perfection, my sinfulness towards holiness, I know the Holy Spirit leads me, guides me, controls me, directs me, teaches me, and prays with me to be like Jesus Christ.

Truly, this is a formidable faith development process. It is a real humbling spiritual walk. I recognized the Holy Spirit's presence towing my soul saying, "God forgives you. God loves you. Now, let us try this again—living a Christ-like life—expressing the fruit of the Spirit by keeping in step with the song, "Fruit of the Spirit," as the farmers sing and dance down on Big Heart Farms."

Like our Sunday School children did, please sing and dance with me: "Fruit of the Spirit is not a coconut (raise up your right arm); Fruit of the Spirit is not a banana (raise up your left arm); Fruit of the Spirit is not a

watermelon (raise up your right leg); Fruit of the Spirit is not a Lemon (raise up your left leg); Fruit of the Spirit is not a cherry (raise up both hands); Fruit of the Spirit is not grapes (hug yourself with both arms). Chorus: Because the Fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self control.

Thank you, Christian Education Director, Christian Education Committee, Church Youth, and Sunday School Children for teaching me the fruit of the Spirit and showing me how to live by the Spirit.

PER CAPITA

Thank you all that have made their contribution to the Per Capita commitment for this year. As of the middle of May, we have received \$1,930.27 of \$3,098 needed. If you have not had the chance to contribute, you still have until December 31. The rate for 2024 is \$29.50 per member.

WHAT IS PER CAPITA?

PER CAPITA has been part of our funding history for over 150 years. When presbyteries, synods, and the General Assembly meet, they are conducting the legislative and judicial business of the church and incur necessary expenses. There are also some necessary administrative expenses involved which enable these ecclesiastical, legislative, and judicial functions to be performed. Historically, per capita has been used to fund these. Importantly, per capita funding enables governing councils to make decisions regarding distribution of mission dollars without itself being funded by those same dollars.

The whole church shares in these expenses since everyone who is a member shares in the benefits of this system of church government. Per capita provides for the financial participation of all local churches as part of a connectional and representative church, thus providing for unity and mutual responsibility within the church.

HOW IS PER CAPITA CALCULATED?

The Per Capita Apportionment in the Presbytery of Lake Huron is based on a portion of certain salaries and expenses which are part of the operating expenses of the Presbytery.

Per Capita is the cost of being a Presbyterian, and if each member pays the per capita amount above his/her pledge or regular giving, pressure on the local budget is reduced.

Paying per capita is similar to:

- contributing one's dish to a potluck meal
- paying to be connected to the internet
- paying for the benefit of utilities, like electricity, gas, water
- pitching in with others to pay for gasoline on a road trip In order to keep presbytery's per capita rate from escalating the per capita portion of the budget is subsidized with a distribution from Presbytery's investments.

WHERE DO OUR PER CAPITA DOLLARS GO?

The amount that is set for per capita apportionment is a calculation based on the number of church members and the budget established annually by each governing body. At the presbytery level per capita pays for a number of items including:

- the mortgage payment on the presbytery office
- the office of the Stated Clerk including his salary and that of the Recording Clerk
- salaries of the Financial Secretary, Treasurer and the Administrative Assistant
- insurance coverage, legal counsel, annual audit
- costs associated with operating the presbytery office meeting costs for our standing units

STEWARDSHIP

Dear Church Family and Friends!

The first quarter contributions were not able to meet the budget needs of the church. A tough decision was then made by Personell Comm. and Session to lay-off or make all support staff volunteers. While this was not a decision that was easy to make, it will hopefully alleviate some stress on being able to pay all our bills.

The Finance Comm., with some additional members, will be meeting again on June 18, at 12:00 noon, to begin discussing budget changes. Winter months always trend downward in giving and upward in some of the costly areas such as Consumers.

Last year the Finance Committee set a goal of stabilizing the check book with a balance of \$12,000 for three months in a row. An added cushion would be helpful in slower months. Unfortunately, this has not been able to occur and then led partly to the current situation.

We are, however, always trying to reduce costs and save in all areas possible of the budget. Your prayerful consideration is appreciated! We have already received some extra and wonderful monetary gifts and appreciate any amount you can contribute.

As a reminder, church finances "ride the waves" and is in no way a reflection on our overall ministry! We are strong and blessed in so many ways and will continue to Praise God through all the ups and downs! May we all be faithful and willing to help fulfill God's plans for our ministry!

Please let us know if you have any concerns or ideas that can be discussed at our next meeting. The Finance Committee members are Lynn Hauk, Terri Rudzitis, and Judy Robertson.
