

"Dynamite Faith"

I remember a 7th Grade English class assignment where I was asked to tell a story about a living relative. I took up the assignment wholeheartedly and talked to the class about how my Grandpa Word "Blew up Mountains." You see, my grandfather worked on the railroad, and in his earlier years working for the Missouri Pacific Railroad in the 1920's he blew up mountains to make railroad tunnels in the Southwestern part of the United States.

There were two relics in his garage that marked this era in his life. They were two small wooden crates marked "Danger—Explosives." They were empty dynamite boxes. When he told me his story in the early 1970's my imagination filled those boxes once more withTNT. He loaned me one box to show the class. It was amazing to share a living story of how one railroad worker shaped the landscape of America with one dynamite stick at a time.

I have always viewed Jesus' words in Matthew 17:20 in light of my grandfather's own story of blowing up mountains. Jesus said, "Because of the littleness of your faith; for truly I say to you, if you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move from here to here,' and it will move; and nothing will be impossible to you." Jesus's words are a challenge. They have always been a challenge for me. I have always asked myself do I have enough faith to move mountains?

I have discovered faith for me is like a stick of dynamite. Listening to my grandpa talk about how he used dynamite to move mountains, I have always thought, "Wow, what a neat thing to do—to move and shape things." Dynamite and faith are very powerful. Both have energy to create and destroy.

Jesus tells us we need to be a faithful people in order to move mountains for the Kingdom of God. I have discovered by listening to our Lord and Savior in Scripture and prayer that faith is a very, very powerful thing, and it must be handled with extreme care. Yes, faith like dynamite can destroy and create new things when it comes to moving mountains.

 communion for 60 in September. It was suggested that for one of the open vacation Sundays for Pastor that we invite


- "Halsey Old Timers" (musical spiritual praise group).


Mark Your Calendars for October 28^{th.} CELEBRATE THE PROMISE- 150 years celebration.

Shoeboxes for Saginaw:

The Shoe Box Saginaw – Women to Women project began several years ago with a simple email message to friends and has since become an annual tradition. Shoeboxes will be collected and distributed to agencies in our community who provide services and programs to women. Boxes will be given to women in the Saginaw community who may not be as fortunate as we are, are unemployed or may be experiencing difficulty in their life and find they are lonely or hurting from life's challenges. This is a simple request to fill a shoebox with new personal items and small gifts for women.

Suggested items for the

shoeboxes: personal items such as full size bottle of shampoo, brush, comb, toothbrush & paste, deodorant, nail file, perfume, lotion, watch, small notebook & pen, book, hat, gloves, socks, non perishable candy, small sewing kit, calendar, kleenex, coin purse, gift card, scarf, bracelet, and the list goes on. What you pack into your shoebox can be as unique as you are but please make sure the items are new and have some gift appeal to them.

Shoeboxes will be available in Fellowship Hall in early November. Each box has a list of items that can be put in the box. All items must be new.

After you have filled your box, return it to the table.

Mission Committee will wrap them and take them to the place where they will then be delivered to the various agencies.





NEW POLICY FOR CHURCH FUNERAL DINNERS

At its monthly meeting in March, the Session adopted a new funeral lunch/dinner policy. The new policy states that there will be a \$3.00 charge per person for a funeral meal to be served to them. This charge is to take effect immediately. This charge will hopefully cover the cost of food, and paper products (e.g. napkins, plates, cups, and plastic eating utensils) used for the meal.

Also, the Session approved upon the recommendation of the church's Funeral Committee (Sharon Leach, Chair; Cindy Maher, Meal Coordinator; Kay Blessing; Bonnie Pratt; Jeff Reed) that a standardized menu be used in preparing the funeral meals. The menu will basically consist of ham and other major food dishes designated and assigned by the funeral meal coordinator, Cindy Maher, and to be cooked in the church's own kitchen. Desserts will be donated by church members and friends. Cindy Maher will contact individuals to make desserts. Hopefully, by preparing the funeral meals in the church's kitchen with a designated work crew, the church will become more efficient in utilizing its resources in the areas of manpower and kitchen facility.

The purpose of this new policy is to help cover the cost of the meal, and to streamline the food preparation process.

Please know that when a funeral lunch or dinner is being served in the church's fellowship hall there is a janitorial fee of \$50.00 to be paid by the family to the church.

Membership with First Presbyterian church of Taymouth is for anyone who



need of the following:


<u>Ushers</u>: If you haven't ushered before but would like to help, let the office know and we'll pair you up with someone who has done it before.
