

# "The Wounded Healer"

I always carry with me two prayers: "The Lord's Prayer" and "The Serenity Prayer." These two prayers are my primary spiritual guide for meditation and contemplation. During this Season of Lent, I have added a third prayer, "Solo Dios basta, God alone is enough," written by Saint Teresa, to help me discern Jesus' phrase, "...I am The Way, The Truth, and The Life..." (John 14:6). The prayer is as follows:

Let nothing disturb you. Let nothing frighten you.

Those who cling to God will lack nothing.

Let nothing disturb you. Let nothing frighten you.

God alone is enough.

(Amen.) (Henri Nouwen, Discernment, p.27)

This prayer is to be prayed very slowly and out loud. It is a prayer to help us to "enter into God's presence, where there is peace and certainty that God is always with us and loves us." (Nouwen, Discernment, p. 27)

Praying for discernment, our ability to experience who God is and who God is not, helps us to confront and fight our personal demons of darkness. We often think life's greatest temptations are always associated with money (greed), sex (lust), and power (success). For some people this may be true, and thus, they construct a way of life to overcome these temptations. As for me, my "shadow," or my "dark demons" comprise of my feelings and thoughts about my own despair, self-rejection, under-confidence, the fear of never being good enough, and not being lovable.

Lent, symbolic of Jesus' own forty days of temptation experience in the wilderness, offers us the same opportunity to get to know ourselves better in life's abyss, and to know who God is and who God is not. Fighting our demons, struggling with Satan, wrestling with our "shadow," (a psychological term used to describe the inner psyche of our sacred soul), uncovering our wounds, and being led by the Holy Spirit to let Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior, to put the healing balm of Gilead upon our bodies, minds, hearts, and souls is Lent 365 days per year. It is from these very wounds that one emerges in what Henri Nouwen calls a "Wounded Healer," a person who gives hope, love, and faith to others through their own wounds of healing. 


