"Live in Joy"

This past summer I read a small devotional book titled, <u>Chasing Joy</u>, by Edward Hays. My desire was to gain insight in how I could increase joy in my daily life. I was inspired to read this book, because during this past Lenten season I thought about how the Apostle Paul conducted his ministry in the midst of his own anguish and suffering. This is clearly seen in his Epistles or Letters to the Early Churches of the New Testament. Paul recognized the essence of joy shapes a person's life, and how a person's life is shaped according to his or her concept of joy.

The Apostle Paul was both a theologian and psychologist. In modern times he would be labeled a "cognitive-behavioral" therapist. The Apostle Paul understands a person's emotional state is shaped by behavior, and that behavior is shaped by one's emotions. Paul's own imprisonment during the time he wrote his Letter to the Philippians readily depicts this. I encourage you to read Paul's entire Letter to the Philippians. Paul found energy in being joyful, and this energy enabled him to serve others with compassion.

I am always amazed in how a physical action or activity can change our perspective. For example, by simply smiling our brain communicates to ourselves (i.e. mind, body, heart and soul) to be happy. This little, often overlooked, physical activity does amazing things in changing our negative perception into a positive one. Feeling this positive emotional energy by moving the corners of our mouths upward is our minds experiencing the love and grace of God daily. Keep smiling.

In joy we find energy. Even when we are tired and exhausted, and not in the mood to serve the needs of others but we do so anyway, is because of God's joy living in our lives. It is through this divine joy that we can enjoy the emotion of joy in serving. In joy we find positive energy, because the Holy Spirit creates a holy attitude within us.

In an ancient religious text there is a saying which captures what the Apostle Paul is illustrating about joy throughout his Epistles:

"Live in Joy"

Live in joy, in love, even among those who hate. Live in joy, in health, even among the afflicted. Live in joy, in peace, even among the troubled. Health, contentment, and trust are your greatest possessions, and freedom your greatest joy. Look within. Be still. Free from fear and attachment, know the sweet joy of the way. (Hays, <u>Chasing Joy</u>, p. 134)

MISSION COMMITTEE:

On July 11, 2019 Bonnie Pratt and Holly Wendzik delivered the items to St Thomas Aquinas Church for the **BROWN BAG LUNCHES**. This was a very interesting and informative visit. Most of the volunteers who pack the lunch bags are retired. Many of them are in their late 70's through 90+ years of age. There were a few younger people there so they are training for the future. They have been doing the brown bag lunches for many years (probably at least 50) and have the process down pat. Each person has their own specific task and the whole process is done in a very short time (they are usually done before 10:00 AM).

Three times a week they provide 40 bag lunches that consist of a sandwich, chips, a piece of fresh fruit, cookies, pudding or jello cup, a few pieces of candy, and a juice box. The items we collected will help provide lunches for a least one week. Recently they ask St. Paul's Episcopal Church if the people ever got tired of the same menu for the lunches. The reply was "Hunger never goes on vacation". Thank you for your help with this project.

It was a very pleasant but a little breezy morning on July 7, 2019 for the out-of-doors worship and **SUNDAY SUNDAE**. Missions was able to treat about 55 church members to ice cream and several different topping of their choice. This was Missions way of saying "Thank You" for all the support that is given for the many different project sponsored by the Missions Committee.

PIE AUCTION was held on Sunday, July 28, 2019. This date was change from what was to be August 18, 2019, due to scheduling conflict. As usually Scott Peters with a fantastic job as auctioneer. With his skills, Missions received \$645.00 to be used for future mission project. Thanks to all who came, baked and/or purchased a pie.

The 10 brooms, dust pans, waste baskets and trash bags will be given to the women as they leave the shelter for the next chapter in their lives. They are now able to live on their own in their own residence. Mustard Seed Shelter has help them through tough times. They have been given the helping and learning hands to move forward with their lives.

Missions has been making deliveries to the **FOOD PANTRY** at SS. Francis and Clare Catholic Church. They provide support to local individuals and families that are in need of assistance. They are to be <u>non-perishable and with current</u> <u>expiration dates.</u> Please remember that our church is asking that you bring your donation on the times we receive communion. NEW POLICY FOR CHURCH FUNERAL DINNERS:

At its monthly meeting in March 2018, the Session adopted a new funeral lunch/dinner policy. The new policy states that there will be a \$3.00 charge per person for a funeral meal to be served to them. This charge is to take effect immediately. This charge will hopefully cover the cost of food, and paper products (e.g. napkins, plates, cups, and plastic eating utensils) used for the meal.

Also, the Session approved upon the recommendation of the church's Funeral Committee (Sharon Leach, Chair; Cindy Maher, Meal Coordinator; Kay Blessing; Bonnie Pratt; Jeff Reed) that a standardized menu be used in preparing the funeral meals. The menu will basically consist of ham and other major food dishes designated and assigned by the funeral meal coordinator, Cindy Maher, and to be cooked in the church's own kitchen. Desserts will be donated by church members and friends. Cindy Maher will contact individuals to make desserts. Hopefully, by preparing the funeral meals in the church's kitchen with a designated work crew, the church will become more efficient in utilizing its resources in the areas of manpower and kitchen facility. The purpose of this new policy is to help cover the cost of the meal, and to streamline the food preparation process. Please know that when a funeral lunch or dinner is being served in the church's fellowship hall there is a janitorial fee of \$50.00 to be paid by the family to the church.
