

"An Embarrassing Question"

I want to wish everyone a Happy New Year! As I look forward to embracing the year, 2023, I do so with our church's commitment of being a Matthew 25 Church of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). As a Matthew 25 Church, our congregation is called to actively engage in the world around us. Being a Matthew 25 Church means committing to act boldly and compassionately by embracing one or more of three areas of focus: building congregational vitality, dismantling structural racism, and eradicating systemic poverty.

The essence of ministering as a Matthew 25 Church lies in the 45th verse of the 25th chapter of the Gospel of Matthew: "Whatever you do to the least of my disciples, you do to me!" My New Year resolution is to follow Jesus' teachings, especially, this one, teaching myself and others to treat people with love and kindness.

I came across a devotion written by Edward Hays, a Roman Catholic priest, who I admire for his spiritual insight. His devotion is entitled, "An Embarrassing Question," which reflects upon Jesus' words (Mt. 25:45). I share this devotion with you from his book, A Pilgrim's Almanac, to ask you to help me become a Matthew 25 Christian pastor. He writes:

Suppose someone offered you a complete four-week vacation for two anywhere in the world, with all expenses paid. The only condition placed upon this gift is that you must first systematically tear off the wings of a butterfly, causing its death. Would you accept the free vacation on those terms? Take a few moments now to ask yourself this question.

I've asked that question to many people, and over 90% of

I've asked that question to many people, and over 90% of them have responded, "No." Then I ask them a second question: "Would you accept the same free vacation if the only condition were that you step on a cockroach?" After an embarrassing pause, 80% of those I asked answered, "Yes." And some even added that they would crush a cockroach even if they were not given an all-expense-paid vacation.

How readily do we discriminate in our respect for life. Since a cockroach is a dirty, germ-carrying insect, we easily feel free to kill it without a thought. But a beautiful butterfly? This attitude, however, doesn't stop with insect life. Jesus, aware of our tendency to make such distinctions, said to us, "Whatever you do to the least of my disciples, you do to me!" (Mt. 25:45). Whatever we do to the law-breaking "cockroaches" of society, we do to Christ. Whatever we do to the disowned parts of ourselves, we do to Christ." (Hays, pp. 82-83, Forest of Peace Books, Easton, KS, 1989)

I invite you to make one of your New Year's resolutions to be helping me in becoming a Matthew 25 Christian pastor, and leading our congregation to minister as a Matthew 25 Church. Please keep me in your thoughts and prayers throughout the year of 2023.

NEWS FROM THE CLERK'S DESK

The following items were discussed and approved at the Dec. 13th Session meeting:

Reviewed, updated, and/or approved Child Protection Policy, Sexual Misconduct Policy, Muriel Lakey & Bell CD sections of the By-Laws.

Approved request of termination of membership for Charlotte Needham as of November 26, 2022.

Budget proposed and approved of \$166,305 for 2023.

Presbytery meeting held at Bay City Westminster Presbyterian Church on Dec. 6th. Discussed what the Presbytery is supposed to be doing for the churches. Also, discussed and approved new disciplinary rules for the Book of Order for General Assembly. Next meeting in March 2023 via Zoom.

Family Game Nights approved: January 13, February 10, March 10, & May 12. Approved Fish Fry for April 28, 2023.

Sent letter to Attorney General, waiting for response. Regarding Wayne Wellman.

Initial equipment purchased for Social Media. It will arrive by the end of the month. Only 2 more components are needed before installation can begin.

Discussed the distribution of Christmas gifts for the staff.

Bus Trip went well on November 29. During the New Year's Eve Bonfire, the old prayer cards will be burnt.

Next session meeting: January 10, 2023, at 7:00 p.m.

Special Session Meeting held on Sunday, December 18, 2022.

Received word from the Attorney General that Wayne Wellman had responded. He stated he would like to be paid the original quoted estimate that had been agreed on during the time that he was here in September. We discussed our options and many thoughts were all spoken of including the fact that we know the work was not as expected and we are very unhappy with how things transpired. However, even though it is an unfavorable outcome, we agreed with 8 yays, 1 neutral, and 1 yay, by way of text that we should conclude our business and pay the original estimate.
