"Never Stop Forgiving"

I would like for us to think about something important. In fact, what I want us to think about is one of the most important things in the whole of the Christian faith. It is something God gave us, and it is something God wants us to give others. What I am talking about is forgiveness. We deal with it every week when we say the Lord's Prayer. "Forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors." Simply put, in Jesus Christ, God has forgiven us, and God expects us to forgive others.

Now of course, it is not as simple as this. When we talk about forgiveness, we must understand from the start forgiveness does not come naturally. If we are hurt by someone, our natural tendency is to get angry and inflict our anger upon that person. In the natural world, if an animal is hurt its instinct is to fight to protect itself. In human society (including the church) we have a whole set of rules in how to cope appropriately with

our anger.

Again, forgiveness does not come naturally. Like anything, we have to work on it. We have to work practicing our Christian faith. Forgiveness is one of those things we need to spiritually practice. In the beginning of the 18th chapter of Matthew, a question was asked by Jesus' disciples, "Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" (v. 1). Throughout the 18th chapter Jesus tells his disciples to become humble, resist temptation, search for the lost, and practice forgiveness. Practicing these things will enable a person to become the greatest in the kingdom of heaven.

Of all these things mentioned by Jesus the one we have the hardest time with is the last one—forgiveness. Peter even interrupts Jesus and asks, "How many times shall my brother/sister sin against me and I forgive him/her?" (vs. 21). Jesus basically answers no one should ever put a limit on forgiveness. One should never

stop forgiving.

Now that is quite a notion! Never stop forgiving. You may ask, "Even if my friends keep hurting me the same way, each time they ask forgiveness I should give it to them?" Jesus would say, "Yes, that is correct." And you may ask, "What kind of crazy person would do that?" The answer is God. God forgives us over and over—even the same sins—and Jesus is telling us to do the same.

The funds collected from this will go to the following Presbyterian programs: Disaster Assistance, Hunger Program and Self-Development of People. In your Sunday morning packet of October 4, 2020, you will receive items regarding your giving to this cause.

Collecting of empty "Shoeboxes" has begun for the annual giving we do in November. As in prior years, you will be given a list of suggested items along with the empty shoebox. They will be ready for you to pick up on Sunday, November 1, 2020.

We are hoping we will be able to do the annual "Cookie Walk and Holiday Treat". We want to make this a safe event for everyone so we are working on just how to do this. If all goes well, the event will be on Saturday, December 19, 2020.

Remember that the "Community Food Pantry" is always in need of items. Once we get back to having worship into the building, the drop off station is located at the top of the south stairs. Here are some of the suggested items they can use: Chicken soup, tomato soup, canned chicken or tuna fish, Ramon noodles, juices, instant potatoes (box or pouch), scallop potatoes (box), Zataran rice and beans, Rice-A-Roni, canned peas and canned carrots, and dry powered milk. You may also use a pew envelope for donations to this cause.

SHOEBOXES FOR SAGINAW

Once again Taymouth Presbyterian Church will be participating in Shoeboxes for Saginaw. This is our 9th year of helping women. Last year over 30 boxes were filled by the women in our church and were given to women in the Saginaw community who may not be as fortunate as we are, are unemployed, or may be experiencing difficulty in their life and find they are lonely or hurting from life's challenges. Some of the agencies that receive the shoeboxes are: The Salvation Army, Emmaus House, East Side Soup Kitchen, McNally House, Ascension House (Emerson House), Rescue Mission, Underground Railroad and many others.

Boxes will be available later in October, but I thought I would get the information out to you so you could start looking for items for the boxes. PLEASE NOTE: THE TOPS OF THE BOXES NEED TO CLOSE. YOU ARE ALL SO GENEROUS WITH LOTS OF WONDERFUL ITEMS, BUT WE NEED TO BE ABLE TO CLOSE THE BOX AND WRAP IT.

What you pack into your shoebox can be as unique as you are but please make sure the items are NEW and have some gift appeal to them. NO PERSONAL HYGIENE ITEMS. AVOID BULKY ITEMS SUCH AS SHAWLS OR TOWELS. Here is a list that will help you. Do Not feel that you have to provide all of these items. Some suggestions for the shoebox: full size bottle of shampoo, brush, comb, toothbrush & paste, deodorant, nail file, perfume, lotion, watch, small notebook & pen, book, hat, gloves, socks, non-perishable candy, small sewing kit, calendar, Kleenex, coin purse, bracelet, scarf.

The deadline for shoeboxes will be November 29th. Do not wrap the box. Mission Committee will do the wrapping.

Per Capita. Not something we all like to think about but a very important responsibility as a member of our church. Per Capita has been a part of our funding history for over 150 years. When Presbyteries, Synods, and the General Assembly meet, they are conducting the legislative and judicial business of the church. Per capita is used to fund these governing councils that represent us. The whole church shares in this expense since everyone who is a member shares in the benefits of this system of church government. Per capita provides for the financial participation of all local churches, thus providing for unity and mutual responsibility within the church.

The Per Capita cost per member is \$29.00. As of August, we have collected \$1995.00. Our total cost due is \$3944.00. Within the last four months of the year, the remaining balance will be divided into equal payments of \$487.25. If you have already paid your Per Capita-Thank you! If you haven't been able to pay yet, there is still time. Please prayerfully consider sending in your \$29.00 before the end of the year.

Virtual Worship by way of video or live-streaming will continue to take place to ensure those who choose to remain home will have a meaningful worship experience.

Those who remain home may receive a telephone call from a Session Elder in order to remain connected to the congregation.

What We CANNOT Do

We cannot guarantee that there will be no one present who has the virus.

We cannot guarantee that the COVID-19 virus will not be present in the church.

All people who attend public worship at the church do so knowing that that there is a risk of contracting the virus.

WHAT WE NEED YOU TO DO

STAY HOME if you are high-risk or in any way think you have the virus or were exposed to it.

Services are planned to last between 30-40 minutes. You may remain in your vehicle during the worship service, or sit on the lawn with a mask.

If you do depart your car, you are asked to wear a mask and maintain a six-foot distance.

The east doors of the church building (location: the elevator entrance) will be open for bathroom usage only.

Please immediately return to your vehicle after using the bathroom.

PLEASE STAY HOME IF YOU...

- Have the virus or might have been exposed to the virus
- Feel sick or ill on any Sunday morning,
- Are At high-risk if you contract COVID-19

REQUIRED

Outdoor Service Format

Upon arrival:

- We ask that you will either pull into the front row reserved for those watching from their car, or pull into the second row for those planning to watch from the lawn.
- If pulled into the front to watch from your car, we ask you pull in square to the grass regardless of the parking lot's lines.

Just before Worship:

 An usher will greet you with a prepackaged Ziploc bag with worship items: a bulletin; a prayer card; and offering envelope (if needed in case you didn't bring your own).
 Please prepare these items so they can be collected during the service by ushers.

Indoor Service Format

Upon arrival:

- Only the South and East Entrances will be used to enter the church.
- Depending on preference and total attendance, you will be ushered either upstairs to the Sanctuary or downstairs to the Fellowship hall.
- Upstairs, every other pew is marked off to ensure social distancing, and downstairs, tables are spaced to ensure social distancing.

Just before worship:

- Please keep your coat with you in the pew.
- An usher will greet you with a prepackaged Ziploc bag with worship items: a bulletin; a prayer card; and offering envelope (if needed in case you didn't bring your own). Please prepare these items so they can be collected during the service by ushers.

During worship the furnace heating the sanctuary will be turned off so as to minimize the closed air circulation.

After the service we ask that you wait to be dismissed.
