"Generosity"

"You were born owning nothing and with nothing you will pass out of this life. Be frugal and you can be generous." (Ethan Hawke, Rules for a Knight, p. 87)

I empathize with my fellow Christian brothers and sisters of the Roman Catholic Church in their sadness regarding the passing of Pope Francis. I must say I did admire Pope Francis. I admired his attitude of generosity in giving and living freely. He courageously embraced everyone with a gift of generosity. He showed what it meant to be rich, not by accumulating vast sums of wealth, but by needing very little. This, of course, reflects Pope Francis' frugal lifestyle both as Cardinal and Archbishop of Buenos Aires, and as Pope living in the Vatican.

Being frugal does not mean being cheap or stingy. Quite the contrary, it means living abundantly and giving fully our resources (monetary and non-monetary) to God, and to others who are in charitable need. Frugality means the giving of our selves (space, time, and energy) to create change. This develops Christian character. This inspires Christian discipleship. Living and giving freely enables us to produce kindness, compassion, and love in an inhospitable world.

A frugal generosity story: Once upon a time a Christian knight came upon an impoverished and starving child. The knight handed the boy some sweet bread from his horse. Instead of devouring the cake as the knight imagined he would, the boy held it very carefully in his hands, sprinted to

his younger siblings, and divided the bread into three pieces. Never had the knight witnessed such profound and simple generosity. The knight no longer felt pity for this starving young boy. He admired the boy. The knight said to his fellow knights, "My character had never been tested like his, and if it ever was, I hoped I would respond with his integrity." (Hawke, Rules for a Knight, p. 90)

The quality of our character determines our worth. Be frugal. Be generous. Shalom, Pastor Scott


Military Appreciation Month


