"Leaf Peeping"

There is an annual pilgrimage each fall in the great northeast of the United States, and this includes the state of Michigan. The annual pilgrimage is no other than "leaf peeping." Since coming to Michigan, Jane and I have tried to get out each fall, travelling by car to see this beautiful spectacular event unfold before our eyes. This year will be no different. Seeing Michigan's panoramic view of fall foliage is breathtaking.

My first experience in leaf peeping came about twenty-three years ago in New England when I took liberty for one weekend from the Navy Chaplain School located in Newport, Rhode Island, and traveled the backroads of Massachusetts, New Hampshire, and Vermont. I quickly discovered that this Octoberfest event of leaf peeping is one gigantic parade of cars; people driving between 5-10 miles per hour down any road they can looking for that perfect colorful leaf. It became quickly apparent to me that the classical leaf

Now, I have to admit I chuckled upon my first sight of these leaf peepers in action. By observing them my admiration only grew. These leaf peepers were indeed on a pilgrimage quest of finding the ultimate colorful shapely leaf: parades of cars sputtering down rural roads coming to a sudden stop; vehicles being randomly parked along the road side disembarking their passengers; young and old alike toting magnifying glasses, tree identification books and cameras to the forest's edge where the red, yellow, and orange leaves lived. Yes, they were on a quest to view God's handiwork.

What made me chuckle a little harder, and again, what made me admire these leaf peepers even more was how they pulled and tucked on the many trees' leafy branches looking for that perfect specimen of shape and color. Pulling the branches towards them and raising their magnifying glasses up to the leaf in order to look at it closely was an effort of true dedication in their endeavor to discover God's world in depth in something so small and fragile. Beautiful leaves, colorful leaves, bountiful leaves, all for the viewing. Fall's coloring of leaves calls us to the beauty of change. I invite you to travel the backroads of Michigan, and to walk the backyards of your homes to see God's painting. Become a leaf peeper and walk the tree-line. Become a leaf peeper and pull those branches to your nose. Be a leaf peeper and place your eyes upon the magical leaf. Be a leaf peeper and look closely to see God's most colorful spectacle of yellows, reds, and oranges.

Observe the change in autumn colors and be blessed with a deep profound spiritual journey.

- Session Education presented by Elder Kathy Maurer on "Matthew 25 Church." What is a Matthew 25 Church? Matthew 25:31-46 calls all of us to actively engage in the world around us, so our faith comes alive and we wake up to new possibilities. Session Members are to research their brochure on "Matthew 25" and decide if we would like to become a "Matthew 25 Church".
- Members excused: Tiffany Fortier, Cheryl Rogers, Robert Minard and Bonnie Pratt. Quorum was present.
- Accepted agenda as presented in addition, address emergency disaster and pulpit supply compensation.
- Approved minutes of the June 11, 2019 regular stated session meeting with one correction.
- Accepted Treasurers report with deficit (\$8,271.43) for the month/year ending August 2019.
- Mission engagement and support as to where, what and how mission money has been used, will be included in annual report for annual meeting.
- Voted to place Church ad in the Birch Run High School Yearbook.
- Building and Grounds: Further discussion on laminate for front door, Neal Rogers is willing to proceed with installation and will laminate. 

NEW POLICY FOR CHURCH FUNERAL DINNERS:

At its monthly meeting in March 2018, the Session adopted a new funeral lunch/dinner policy. The new policy states that there will be a \$3.00 charge per person for a funeral meal to be served to them. This charge is to take effect immediately. This charge will hopefully cover the cost of food, and paper products (e.g. napkins, plates, cups, and plastic eating utensils) used for the meal.

Also, the Session approved upon the recommendation of the church's Funeral Committee (Sharon Leach, Chair; Cindy Maher, Meal Coordinator; Kay Blessing; Bonnie Pratt; Jeff Reed) that a standardized menu be used in preparing the funeral meals. The menu will basically consist of ham and other major food dishes designated and assigned by the funeral meal coordinator, Cindy Maher, and to be cooked in the church's own kitchen. Desserts will be donated by church members and friends. Cindy Maher will contact individuals to make desserts. Hopefully, by preparing the funeral meals in the church's kitchen with a designated work crew, the church will become more efficient in utilizing its resources in the areas of manpower and kitchen facility. The purpose of this new policy is to help cover the cost of the meal, and to streamline the food preparation process. Please know that when a funeral lunch or dinner is being served in the church's fellowship hall there is a janitorial fee of \$50.00 to be paid by the family to the church.
