"The Cross"

The Apostle Paul writes: "For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, to us who are being saved it is the power of God." (I Corinthians 1:18)


The other day I took note of the number of crosses in my office. I have sixteen crosses hanging on the wall. I have one cross hanging on a stand on top of my file cabinet. I have five crosses laying in the bay window. I found one cross leaning against a book on one of the bookshelves. I also noted there are two crosses within a couple of plaques. No telling how many crosses are laying on my desk. I will not know that number until I "spring" clean my desk. I am simply amazed at how many crosses are in one office.

I know each cross has a story about Jesus' death and resurrection. I realize each cross shapes a vision of what Christian ministry looks like. Like the hymn, "Be Thou My Vision," based on Proverbs 29:18, "Where there is no vision, the people perish; but those who keeps God's law, happy are they." These crosses in my office become a visual guide to follow Jesus' life and teachings.

Our annual Wednesday night Lenten pilgrimage this year, with our fellow churches of Birch Run and Burt, helps us to capture the vision of Jesus' cross. The devotional study, "Guided to the Cross," guides us towards a vision of forgiveness, hope, peace, love, trust, perseverance, and grace.

I envision the cross as a driving force that pulls people closer together in developing a deeper understanding of our faith. Our spiritual vision of the cross deeply directs our attitude about life. Our attitude is often the difference between success and mediocrity.

Jesus' cross creates the vision of true awareness of God's power.
